SYMPOSIUM BY THE UMKC LAW REVIEW

- **Public-Private Financing Enterprise: Economic Impact of Constructing Sporting Facilities on Local and National Economies**
- **Performance Enhancing Drugs and the Law Affecting Professional & Amateur Sports**
- **Beyond the Field: Roles, Rights and Responsibilities**

All essays must be submitted by August 1, 2007. All essays must be original and no part of the article may be from a previously published work. Your essay should be

approximately 25-30 manuscript pages, although we can accommodate a longer piece with adequate notice. This solicitation for essays is not a promise to publish your essay but authors will be notified promptly regarding acceptance of their submissions.
